Our first full year in our Coronation Square premises has been a busy one – at the science centre, across Gloucestershire and further afield.



2912 visitors including 948 during the summer holidays – this is a 155% increase on 2017

96 annual family passes giving families of up to 5 people unlimited visits to the science centre for 12 months

45 drop-in STEM clubs Since September, children have been able to earn a sticker for each completed challenge as they work towards a CREST Star or SuperStar award

22 robot clubs Our programmable Lego continues to be popular since we first introduced it during February half term

14 volunteers including Shaun who was on placement with us until June as part of his university degree
